Dear parent/carer

Important COVID-19 information

We have been advised by Public Health England that a member of our Academy community has been positively confirmed as having contracted COVID-19.

We have been in contact with your child to discuss the need for them to self-isolate as they have been in contact with this individual. If your child has been contacted by Test and Trace they must follow the instructions on the App and return to the Academy when their period of self-isolation ends. Those students who we have identified as having to self-isolate must do so for 14 days, returning to the Academy on 30 November 2020.

Anyone else living in the same household does not need to self-isolate UNLESS someone in your household displays Covid-19 symptoms.

You do not need to get your child tested for Covid-19 unless they display symptoms.

Learning provision for students

Lessons can be accessed via a Teams invite from the class teacher. All materials/resources can be accessed in the content library on Teams.

We know that you may find this concerning, but we are continuing to monitor the situation and are working closely with Public Health England. The remainder of this letter provides advice on how to support your child. Please be reassured that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come into the Academy and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms should seek a test and this can be arranged via https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, childcare setting, school, college or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home only.

If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- · a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
