Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8-13 are entitled:

- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point:
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

Premises and facilities

The school will make the main hall, classrooms or private meeting rooms available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available audio visual and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Leader or a member of their team.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature at the Careers Resource Centre, which is managed by the school librarian. The Resource Centre is available to all students at lunch and break times.

All visiting speakers must adhere to our school vetting policy:

- All guest speakers must send emails from a registered company not a private email.
- All must sign in and wait to be collected from main reception

 □ All have a
 member of staff with them at all times.
- All are escorted to the main reception to sign out.
- Emails are exchanged to discuss the topic and delivery prior to the visit.
- · Safeguarding and fire evacuation instructions are reviewed when signing in.

In addition

Staff from organisations such as Amnesty International, DWP, NCS etc have their work ID available

Speakers for Schools is a company that provides high profile speakers to come into schools. These speakers are vetted by the organisation, the principal approved our school to part of their organisation. When arranging a visit the speakers for schools coordinator is made aware of the time, duration and locations of the talk as well as the target audience. There is then a follow up email when you have to give feedback about your speaker.

Businesses that come in have registered to be part of the schools and business project with the senior project officer for economic growth Newark and Sherwood council

Visitors that come in regularly – our progression specialist or a university volunteer for work placement have a letter of comfort from their employer plus provide ID such as passport or drivers licence.
