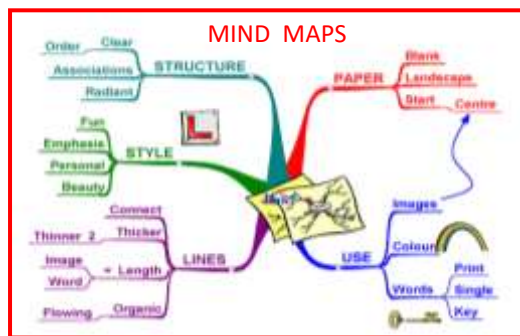

DUOLINGO - An absolute classic! Duolingo is probably the best free language-learning app you can find. It's unlikely to take you from a beginner to being fluent, or even conversationally proficient, but it gives you exercises that help you learn a lot about a new language and practice it daily.

QUIZLET - 'Old school' and a bit limited in scope, Quizlet is an excellent study aid (app-based flashcards) for learning anything that relies on memorisation, such as learning Spanish vocabulary in various topic areas.



Beelinguapp - Beelinguapp is an excellent language-learning app, with a generous free version, that focuses on reading and reading comprehension. You use the filters to find materials that match your interests and skill level.

busuu - busuu is an attractive app and is extremely well organised, which allows for good scaffolding. The free account has a lot of limitations, but it's decent enough if you're using busuu only to practice vocabulary with flashcards for one language.



Memrise - Create an account today to use across multiple devices and learn wherever you are - even without data or WiFi (app only). Practice your speaking with pronunciation exercises (app only). Watch video clips of local speakers using real-life language.

Wlingua - This app could be perfect for you, whatever your level of Spanish - beginner, basic, intermediate, or advanced. 500+ lessons with hundreds of vocabulary and grammar exercises. You can also practice your reading and listening comprehension skills.



50languages - This free app has 30 lessons. With no prior knowledge, you will learn to fluently speak short sentences in real-world situations in no time. The 50 languages method successfully combines audio and text for effective language learning.

Language Transfer - Made up of 90 audio lessons that help learners build a foundation in the language by teaching a method for thinking your way through it. The course draws heavily on the similarities between English and Spanish. This isn't a fancy app with animations or pictures. As far as quality of instruction and learning potential, it's hard to beat this free app.
