The Year 7 Bridge

We also do transition very differently at The Dukeries Academy. In Year 7, all pupils are inducted into our Year 7 Bridge. We know that change can be exciting, but we also know that our pupils need excellent support so that they can transition effectively into secondary school. Our transition offer is unique in the local area and highly sought-after by families. In summary:

- You will be based in the Year 7 Bridge with your own suite of "home" classrooms. Here, pupils engage in warm, organised line-ups, where they receive key messages for the day from the Head of Bridge and where we check uniform and equipment. We also do lots of celebrating success! You will also experience Morning Meeting every day with your coach, where you will learn the essential knowledge you need to be successful. The Bridge is a calm and safe environment for Year 7 pupils they tell us regularly as part of pupil voice.
- Coaching time, as well as all English, Mathematics and Humanities lessons, will be based in The Bridge, reducing the need for movement around the Academy, and maintaining some similarities to Primary school.
- For other subjects that require specialist facilities or equipment, you will line-up, and be met by your teachers, who will take you to the correct place. Again, reducing any anxiety about where to go or how to get there.

- Year 7 pupils have their own yard, away from older pupils, as they grow in confidence within the community. This means that during break and lunch, they will socialise within their Year Group and be supervised by trusted members of staff.
- The Year 7 Bridge has developed into an Outstanding provision, and we are working hard to make further improvements for our next cohort; the third through this form of transition.

Beyond The Bridge

Whether you are interested in science, sports, music, drama, or any other subject or activity, there is something for everyone at The Dukeries Academy. We encourage you to get involved, try new things, and embrace all that secondary education has to offer.

4) Pupils will be invited to Transition Week, which will involve time in the Academy learning and experiencing The Bridge, as well as an off-site activity.

5) Parents will attend Transition Evening, where they can seek further clarification, advice or support.
