1	'Small Island' is set in Jamaica (including Kingston) and England (including Lincolnshire and London).			
2	The play adaptation of 'Small Island' was written by Helen Edmundson .			
3	The original novel upon which the play 'Small Island' is based was written by Andrea Levy.			
4	The novel focuses on the perspectives of Windrush immigrants (Gilbert, Hortense) and English people (Queenie, her family).			
5	The play is set in the 1920s-40s.			
6	People who migrated to the United Kingdom from the Caribbean after World War Two are known as the Windrush Generation .			
7	Many people were motivated to move from the Caribbean to the UK at this time to find better paid job opportunities following World War Two.
